

## SUGGESTIONS ON HOW TO PREPARE THE DRAWING OF A DECO SHAPE BATH

Each DECO SHAPE bath is one of a kind – made to the measures and drawing provided by client

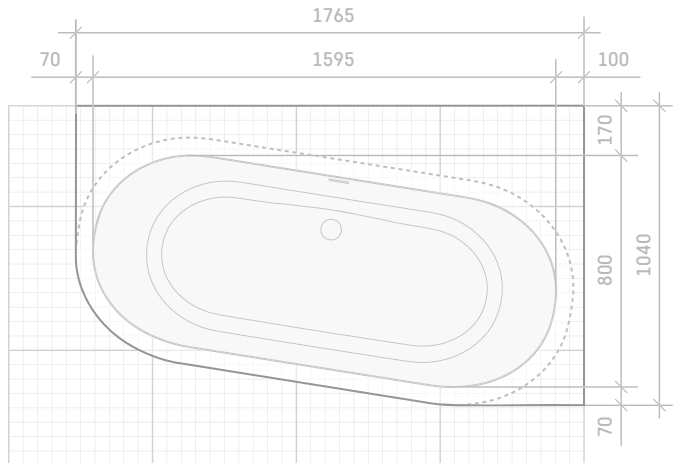
### How to measure

- All measurements have to be made:
  - in millimeters;
  - for the height of bath surface;
  - to walls with done finishing, e.g., walls with tiles.
- Make sure the walls are straight, to avoid unexpected gaps between the wall and bath

### How to draw your bath

- Explore the illustration *Example of a bath drawing*
- Choose one side of grid in the drawing *Maximum size of a bath's surface* to represent a side of your bath that is next to the wall, then draw other walls that will border your bath
- Cut out (alongside dashed line) bath from the illustration *Minimum size of a bath* and see where it fits in your drawing, glue it once there is a perfect fit
- Draw the outer border(s) of your bath  
IMPORTANT! Mark the place for mixer tap and make sure that water supply is feasible there. The same goes for draining of water
- Show measures for all elements of your bath in the same manner, as in illustration *Example of a bath drawing*


### Example of a bath drawing:

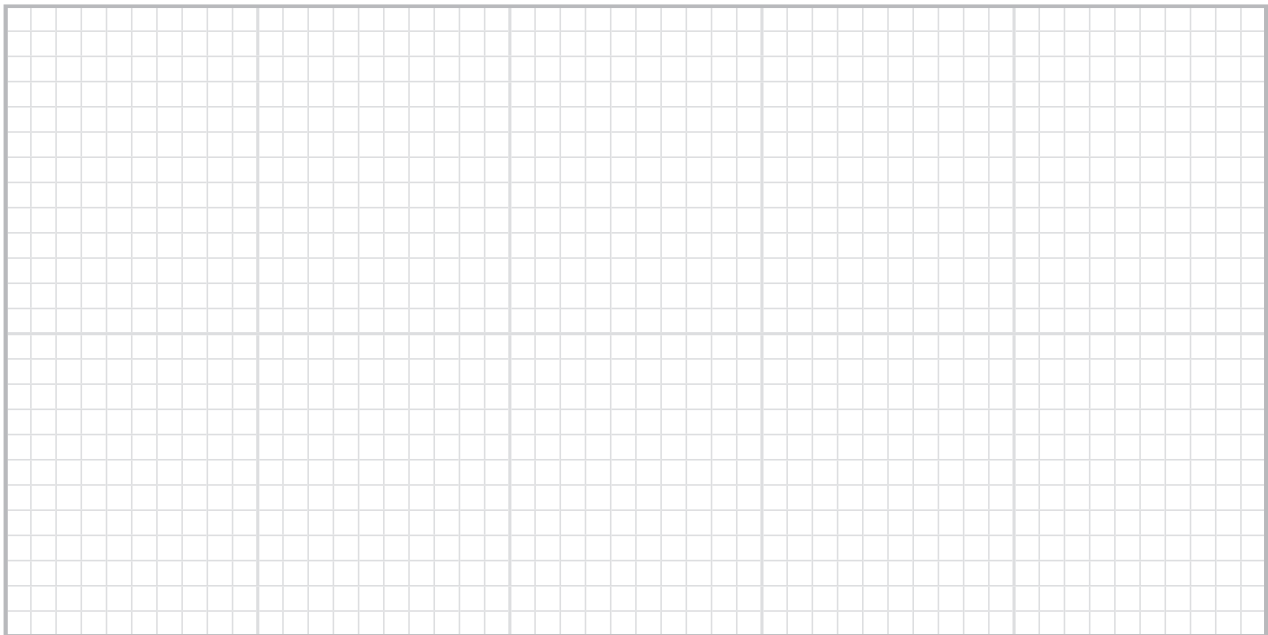


- Indicate the location of the mixer tap cut-outs and their diameters in the drawing
- Indicate the surface tint: \_\_\_\_\_

### Maximum size of a bath's surface

2500 × 1275 mm; 1 box = 50 × 50 mm

 = 50 × 50 mm



### Minimum size of a bath 1660 × 750 mm
